

Enjoy your stay in Herne Bay

Herne Bay and the surrounding area offers a wealth of attractions to visitors, from fishing trips and seal watching to organised boat trips to visit the historic Maunsell Army Sea Forts and the futuristic wind farms just off the coast. More sedate activities include attractive gardens and promenades, a variety of musical and dramatic entertainment at the refurbished Bandstand and at the Kings Hall, an interesting town museum and a variety of pubs (including four micro pubs), clubs and restaurants to cater for all tastes.

For the history and culture buffs there is the ancient Roman site of Reculver just around the coast, the cathedral city of Canterbury with it's cobbled streets, thriving pedestrianised city centre with cafes, bars and art gallery. A few miles away at Manston is an R.A.F. museum dedicated to the Battle of Britain pilots. A couple of miles in the other direction is the picturesque town of Whitstable with it's working harbour, many fish restaurants and age old association with oysters.

Whatever your taste may be, Herne Bay and the area around it offers all that you could possibly want. Nature lovers, culture lovers, food and drink lovers and old fashioned seaside town lovers are all catered for!

Recommended visits

The Reculver Towers

The imposing twin towers of the medieval church at Reculver dominate the skyline of Herne Bay, acting as a navigation marker for ships at sea. This was the site of one of the earliest Roman forts built against Saxon raids on the 'Saxon Shore'. It later became the site of an Anglo-Saxon monastery before becoming the parish church for Reculver. The tall towers were built in a remodelling of the church in the 12th century. Much of the site has been lost to coastal erosion, but alongside the twin towers are the ruined remains of the early Roman fort.

Wildwoods Discovery Park

A woodland park set in over 40 acres of beautiful ancient woodland, where you can come nose-to-nose with over 50 species of British Wildlife past and present. Over 200 native animals including Wolves, Bison, Deer, Owls, Foxes, Red Squirrels, Wild Boar, Lynx, Wild Horses, Badgers, Beavers and (new in 2015) Brown Bears.
